Who is Alexander Paley?

Alexander Paley is widely recognized for his exceptionally broad and extensive repertoire of concerti and solo piano works, his dazzling technical prowess, and his convincing, personal interpretations.

Since September 2021, Mr. Paley holds a position as professor at Vytautas Magnus University Music Academy in Lithuania. During this time he established the group Paleasis, whose ten musicians play a wide repertoire in many cities in Lithuania. In Vilnius, with his wife Peiwen Chen, he performed the complete chamber music of Brahms for piano, with six concerts in the 2021 season and another four in 2022. Performances with Lithuanian State Symphony Orchestra include concerts of Beethoven, Haydn, and Grieg.

On February 7, 2024, Moldova President Maia Sandu presented the title of "People's Artist" to Alexander Paley. Said President Sandu, "I am glad that, having made a very successful international career, the artist remains tied to Moldova, the place where he was born and where he was formed from a musical point of view, and [that he has] for many years promoted the music of composers of Moldova."



Biography



Born in Chişinău (Kishiniev), Moldova, Mr. Paley won the National Music Competition of Moldova at the age of sixteen.

Subsequently, he studied at the Moscow Conservatory with Bella Davidovich and Vera Gornostayeva, completing his graduate work in 1981. He won First Prize at the Leipzig International Bach Competition in 1984, the Bösendorfer Prize in 1986, the Grand Prix at the first International Pancho Vladigerov Competition in 1988, First Prize at Alex de Vries in 1990 and Les Victoires de la Musique Classique in 2006.

The Washington Post called Mr. Paley's 1991 debut with the National Symphony a "flawless performance", and since then he has earned similar accolades for performances with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Boston Pops, Aspen Festival Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, and the St. Louis, San Diego, Utah, Colorado, Milwaukee, Seattle, and Syracuse Symphony Orchestras. In the 1996–97 season, he made his Carnegie Hall debut with the American Composers Orchestra in the world premiere of a new concerto by Sheila Silver. *The New York Times* wrote, "The pianist...played like a man possessed."
